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ABOUT SEARCCT

The Southeast Asia Regional Centre for Counter-Terrorism (SEARCCT) was officially launched on 1 July 2003 by then Minister of Foreign Affairs Of Malaysia, the Honourable Dato' Seri Syed Hamid Albar.

SEARCCT serves as a leading Centre in the Southeast Asia region to train and enhance the capacity of law enforcement and goverment officials on counter-terrorism issues in collaboration with established think-tank, related institutions and international organisations. The Centre also serves to promote Malaysia's perspective on how best to deal with terrorism and to provide a comprehensive approach to counter-terrorism.

SEARCCT utilises various training courses, conferences, and forums to discuss and disseminate the imperative to have a multi-pronged and multi-faceted approach in countering terrorism. In implementing its mission, SEARCCT has identified seven flagships. These flagships are:

- · Investigation and Legal Aspect,
- CBRNE and Crisis Management,
- Aviation, Maritime and Transport Security,
- Cyber Terrorism,
- Prevention and Rehabilitation,
- Terrorism Financing, and
- Youth and Terrorism.



From August 2003 to December 2017, a total of 218 training courses, were conducted with the participation of 8,224 local and foreign officials. SEARCCT programmes include field visits as well as practical and simulation exercises designed to add value and provide an interesting learning experience for the participants.

In 2017, SEARCCT took the initiative to further strengthen its programme syllabus, enhance existing collaborations with relevant local and foreign institutions, and establish further links with international and regional organisations, such as the United Nations and ASEAN. Programmes developed by SEARCCT focus on existing and perceived future threats, while catering to the needs of its clientele.

Since its inception, SEARCCT has had numerous collaborations with foreign and local agencies. In 2017, SEARCCT collaborated with the Embassy of the United States of America, New Zealand High Commission, Canadian High Commission and Embassy of France. As such, SEARCCT welcomes proposals for productive collaborations with local and foreign institutions and organisations to enrich its programmes. SEARCCT also organises public lectures, forums, roundtable discussions, seminars and workshops for interested organisations and individuals. They include, among others, government officials, academicians and university students, representatives from think tanks, non-governmental organisations, training institutes, as well as members of the diplomatic corps based in Kuala Lumpur.

Although this prospectus only reflects several collaborators, changes and conditions of co-operation with other partners will be included once the details of joint-training programmes have been confirmed. The list of programmes and collaborators are therefore not exhaustive.


