



ABOUT SEARCCT

The Southeast Asia Regional Centre for Counter-Terrorism (SEARCCT) was officially launched on 1 July 2003 by then Minister of Foreign Affairs Of Malaysia, the Honourable Dato' Seri Syed Hamid Albar.

SEARCCT serves as a leading Centre in the Southeast Asia region to train and enhance the capacity of law enforcement and government officials on counter-terrorism issues in collaboration with established think-tank, related institutions and international organisations. The Centre also serves to promote Malaysia's perspective on how best to deal with terrorism and to provide a comprehensive approach to counter-terrorism. These suits with Foreign Minister's desire to take SEARCCT to a higher level in the realm of counter-terrorism within the Asean region.

In order to implement its mission, SEARCCT utilizes various training courses, conferences, and forums to discuss and disseminate the imperative to have a multi-pronged and multi-faceted approach in countering terrorism. To give more focus, since 2018 SEARCCT has reconstructed its flagships from seven to five. These flagships today are:

- Investigation and Legal Aspect,
- CBRNE and Crisis Management,
- Critical Infrastructure Protection,
- Terrorism Financing, and
- Countering Violent Extremism (CVE) and Preventing Violent Extremism (PVE).

From August 2003 to December 2019, a total of 264 training courses, were conducted with the participation of 10,278 local and foreign officials. SEARCCT programmes include field visits as well as practical and simulation exercises designed to add value and provide an interesting learning experience for the participants.

In 2019, SEARCCT took the initiative to further strengthen its programme syllabus, enhance existing collaborations with relevant local and foreign institutions, and establish further links with international and regional organisations, such as the United Nations and ASEAN. Programmes developed by SEARCCT focus on existing and perceived future threats, while catering to the needs of its clientele. Since its inception, SEARCCT has had numerous collaborations with foreign and local agencies. In 2019,



SEARCCT collaborated with the United Nations, Asean Secretariat, Commonwealth Secretariat, Embassy of the United States of America and High Commission of Australia. As such, SEARCCT welcomes proposals for productive collaborations with local and foreign institutions and organisations to enrich its programmes. SEARCCT also organises public lectures, forums, roundtable discussions, seminars and workshops for interested organisations and individuals. They include, among others, government officials, academicians and university students, representatives from think tanks, non-governmental organisations, training institutes, as well as members of the diplomatic corps based in Kuala Lumpur.

Although this prospectus only reflects several collaborators, changes and conditions of co-operation with other partners will be included once the details of joint-training programmes have been confirmed. The list of programmes and collaborators are therefore not exhaustive.

Objective:

- This course will provide participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to develop policies, procedures, training and operational capabilities to deter, prevent, interdict, respond to and mitigate the effects of a suicide bombing.

Learning Outcomes:

- Upon completion of the PRSBI course the participant will obtain the necessary knowledge, skills and abilities to respond to cases especially in terrorist's suicide bombing.

Module Contents:

- Course introduction.
- Defining the suicide bombing threat from Terrorist organizations, case studies, evolution of suicide bombings, likely targets, phases of suicide bombings, and psychological aspects of suicide bombers, how emergency organizations can disrupt terrorist cells.
- Information collection, indications and warnings.
- Identify and discuss counter terrorist protective information, recognize common pre-attack indicators, post attack behavior, interviewing techniques.
- Legal and personal protection issues.
- Justification for use of deadly force, minimum evacuation distances related to the 3 types of bomb devices, civil liability pertaining to the use of deadly force, identify pre and post blast personal protection issues.
